2. What caught your attention in the video or reading? Was anything confusing, surprising, or especially meaningful to you?
3. In one or two sentences, how would you share the message of Nahum with someone?

4. How do you feel about the idea that God can be both loving and wrathful at the same time? Do those seem like conflicting qualities?
5. Jonah and Nahum tell two parts of Assyria's story—one where God's love for the oppressor gave them a chance to repent, and one where His love for the oppressed brought destruction and freedom. They show us this surprising truth about wrath: that God rises up against evil for the sake of its victims. Does this impact the way you think about God's wrath and love? If so, how?
6. Read James 1:19-20. Can you think of examples where "human anger" hurt relationships? How might that situation look different if the anger was motivated by compassion instead?
7. How do you think the people who experienced Assyria's oppression would have received the message that God is their Avenger? How can we present God's wrath as a message of hope for those suffering today?
