
The six sections below cover the entire book of Joel.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> In the Bible, judgment is about evaluating actions and motives, discerning between good and evil, and what's real and what's fake. Paul tells us that 'We must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each of us may receive what is due us for the things done while in the body, whether good or bad' (2 Cor. 5:10), but he also writes, 'There is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus' (Romans 8:1). Christians will experience God's judgment on their sin (Gal. 6:7-8) as a form of discipline to shape us into the image of Christ (Heb. 12:6, 10).
